

NURSERY RULES AND POLICIES

These rules and policies have been established for the benefit and safety of your child. Safety is our number one concern and following these rules can greatly help insure the safety of all children utilizing our facility.

- ❑ Nursery services are available for children 6 weeks – 13 years of age.
- ❑ **NO FOOD ALLOWED.** Bottles or covered drinks are allowed, but must be labeled with child's first and last name.
- ❑ Staff is not allowed to administer medications or mix bottle formula.
- ❑ No gum chewing.
- ❑ Children are required to wear socks or shoes while in the child care area.
- ❑ Please make sure your child has a fresh diaper before dropping them off.
- ❑ Nursery staff may page you to assist with diaper changing duties during busier times.
- ❑ Please note that it is the parents responsibility to provide wipes and diapers for their child. Diaper bags must be labeled with the child's name.
- ❑ In order to pick up your child, you must be in possession of the numbered sticker given to you by the nursery attendant.
- ❑ You may be asked to pick up your child if they are inconsolable.
- ❑ Children with possible infectious illness should be left at home. They should not have the following within the last 24 hours: colds, runny noses with discolored mucus, pink eye, fever, diarrhea, vomiting, or any communicable illness, (i.e. chicken pox).
- ❑ If your child is home from school for illness reasons, they are not allowed to be in our Nursery.
- ❑ If you are the parent or have legal guardianship of the child by law, there is no charge for Nursery services.
- ❑ If you are not the parent or do not have legal guardianship of the child by law (i.e. grandparent, aunt), there is a \$5.00 Nursery guest fee per child. 10-pass punch cards for Nursery guests are also available for \$50.00.
- ❑ There is a daily limit of 2 hours per child. You will be charged a fee of \$5.00 for every 15 minutes over this time limit.
- ❑ In an effort to provide a safe environment for your child, the nursery staff cleans and disinfects the toys daily.

*Community Health Club has a “3 strike” policy in regards to bad behavior in the nursery. If a child had 3 documented incidents of bad behavior (biting, spitting, hitting, etc.) the Health Club reserves the right to refuse access of your child into the nursery.
